RECREATION & PLAY

Tennis courts, playground, dogs, picnics, field-sports & frisbee.

COMMUNITY EVENTS

Irvington market, concerts in the park, wide range of community events, and parking.

BUILDINGS & FACILITIES

VIA storage shed (not Town of Irvington), permanently installed port-a-potties, small gazebo with power, and un-lit flagpole.

Monthly farmers and vendor market that is open to the public and run by the VIA

Vendors and booths come to Irvington with their wares, goods and services throughout the season

NEW PLAYGROUND



Natural aesthetic, local theme, adaptive, multi-age use, sustainable and safe.



Hard metal, bright primary colors, and the use of plastic or generic playground equipment.



Climbing structure, ninja course, spinner, interactive, shade/cover, benches, and swings.



CHALLENGE S

TENNIS COURTS

While the Town has pad to repair the courts, they are beyond patching at this point and need replacement.

PLAYGROUND

RESTROOMS

Equipment is very old and does not meet current safety and amenity standards for residents.

Portable restrooms are currently used, and while meant to be temporary they have been a permanent installation that needs a more attractive and permanent solution.

STORAGE

While VIA is happy with their storage space, the Town does not have its own storage space and needs to solve for it by the end of 2023.

USABILITY

From the Irvington market days, to concerts and community gathering events, the Commons must be flexible to accommodate a wide range of use.

Recreation for residents and guests of all ages.

Supportive of community events and gatherings.

Safety for all surrounding the Town Commons.

Permanent solutions and upgrades we can all enjoy.

Low maintanance native planting with spaces for garden-club seasonal plants.

Maintain & enhance charming village appearance.

Sustainable design, materials, and structures.

Enhance the beauty of Irvington's "front yard."

Build on what we have, enhancing the Commons for residents and future generations to come.

INITIAL DESIGN Utilizing feedback from previous efforts, the recent town survey, resident and committee inputs; our resident Architects **Randall Kipp** and **Steve Reiss** thoughtfully designed this initial concept for the **Irvington Town Commons**.







SOLUTION S

PERMANENT FACILITIES

Restroom facilities that are attractive and permanent.
Amphitheater, seating, and parking.

THOUGHTFUL DESIGN

Cohesive design throughout the Commons in keeping with the charm and character of Irvington. This is our community's "front yard."

RECREATIONAL USE

New tennis courts (with pickle-ball), multi-age playground, seating, walking path, fitness stations, open fields, and a trail-head for the new TriWay Trail.

EVENTS USE

Supporting parking for 160+ cars, markets, concerts, and community gatherings with the right space and facilities.

PROPOSED TIMELINE

From community input through fruition...

Q1 2023

Q2 2023

- Refine project plan with design & architectural drawings
- Hold second round of workshops with PC & TC/Public
- Complete budget for TC approval
- Allocate financing necessary to complete improvements plan
- Seek bids and award Contract(s)

Q3 2023



PROPOSED TIMELINE

From community input through fruition...

Q4 2023

- Additional land closings
- Grading and site preparation/demo

Q1 2024

- Construction and installation of improvements per scope
- Ready for 1st Irvington Market of 2024

Q2 2024

- Project completion (all finishing touches)
- Grand re-opening of Town Commons ready for July 4th holiday weekend festivities



ROUGH COST ESTIMATE

\$450 K

New playground & amphitheatre

\$300 K

Additional land, septic, restrooms & parking

\$300 K

New tennis courts, parking, trail & landscaping
